Course Description

This class will teach students how to design and create web sites using the Adobe Dreamweaver CS3 interface. Proper page design using tables, frames, and templates will be covered. Skills involving FTP (File Transfer Protocol) will be introduced. Other topics will include Pre-designed Pages, Forms, and CSS (Cascading Style Sheets). There will also be an introduction to dynamic web pages using PHP coding.

Supplies

Students must come prepared for class everyday with: **pen or pencil** and **paper**.

Grading

All course work will be assigned points. At the end of each grading period, accumulated points will be given a grade based on the following percentages: **A=90-100%**, **B=80-89%**, **C=70-79%**, **D=60-69%**.

The final exam will count for 15% of the trimester grade. Each student is required to take the final exam. If a student misses the final exam, they will receive an "I" on their report card.

Attendance and Participation

Student participation is an integral part of the learning process and is dependent on classroom attendance as there is great benefit from interaction with teachers and peers. It is difficult, if not impossible, to duplicate the experiences missed because of an absence. Presence in class provides students the opportunity to ask questions about material not understood, to receive assignments straight from the teacher, to make presentations before classroom audiences and to participate in group learning activities.
